

# LEARNING GUIDE FOR FRANÇAIS AU QUOTIDIEN

A lot of learning happens in the home when you use Français au Quotidien. Here's how we can harness their learning and guide our students in demonstrating what they earned from their engagement in the activities and tasks of our platform.



## Watching

- Watch a lesson, a story, or a documentary about the topic of the week.
- To help you focus on some details, you will be asked some comprehension or grammatical questions.

## Reading

- It is one of the important tasks you will have to achieve each week.
- Reading segments or paragraphs are most of the time facilitated with audio to help the learner practice alone and at his pace his weekly readings.
- In some tasks, you will be required to record your reading to help the managing team measure your progress.



## Writing

- Writing is dispatched through several tasks. It can be done in the learning week or as a separate task to participate in the school forum.

## Speaking

- Each week you will be asked to speak or discuss a topic using specific grammatical rules or vocabulary of the week and to submit your work as recordings to the platform.
- You can create audios, videos, and podcasts to showcase your speaking skills.
- Save all your recordings in one folder in your personal device and come back to it sometime to measure your own speaking progress and self-reflect on your learning.



## Practicing

- Practice the skills you learned throughout the four weeks of the learning Unit.
- Prepare yourself for the final test designed at the end of each Unit (fifth week) and reflect on what you learned.

## Testing

- At this stage, you will be asked to test your knowledge to showcase what you learned at the end of each Unit.
- The final self-assessment includes all the skills you learned combined with the listening, reading, and writing tasks.
- Speaking assessment will take into consideration your weekly tasks to measure your progress and level.
